

## North Town Primary School and Nursery – PE and Sports Premium Funding 2024-25

At North Town Primary School and Nursery, we pride ourselves on promoting healthy lifestyles through the taught curriculum, extra-curricular activities and participation in sports festivals and inter and intra school competitions.

Our school vision is to create a physical education curriculum that motivates, inspires and develops every child's enthusiasm to become a lifelong learner and participator in sport and knowing how to keep fit and healthy. We aim to give opportunities for all pupils to develop their physical, leadership and coaching skills. As a school we want to create a thrill around physical activities where every child feels confident and ready to participate. Additionally, we use money to enable our children to compete in inter school competition as part of our School Games involvement.

**Primary Sports Premium:** This financial year the school will receive £19,680 to support and develop the delivery of high-quality PE and sport in school. We have a school development plan that demonstrates how we intend to achieve this.

**How we will use the money effectively:** Every decision made when spending the money will have a clear intent, linked to one of the 5 key indicators and our PE quality improvement plan.

**Sustainability:** We have ensured that we now have systems in place which will ensure that staff are continually well trained, competition is an integral part of what we do, a rich variety of after school clubs and curricular P.E. opportunities are available and are at the core of what we provide. Our sport and P.E. provision are embedded in the fabric of our school life.
